Requirements for student exchange

- 1. One year of studies must be completed when <u>starting the study period abroad</u>.
- 2. Normal progress in studies.
- 3. The period of exchange should follow the <u>recommendations of the degree programme</u>.
- 4. The exchange period cannot prolong the study period. It is not a valid reason to apply for prolonged study time. The chosen courses at the host institution should be relevant for the curricula at Arcada. The studies should progress at the same pace as is required at Arcada.
- 5. Fulfill the language requirements of the host institution
 - https://europa.eu/europass/en/common-european-framework-reference-language-skills

If the above mentioned requirements are fulfilled, the study plan can be signed. If the student does not fulfill the requirements he/she can apply again later.



When can you go?



- For how long?
 - One semester or possibly two depending on the host university.
 - Check the semester dates of the host university!
- Recommended time: https://start.arcada.fi/en/exchange-studies/studies-abroad/when-can-i-go → When can I go
- If you for some reason do not have the possibility to go on exchange during the recommended time, please contact your International contact person or Study Councellor to see if there are other possibilities

N.B!

- Nursing eng students: 2 practical placements (15cr) done in Finland need to be completed before a placement abroad.
- Nursing swe students: should do the following practical placements in Finland before a placement abroad: grundvård 5sp, inremedicinskvård 10sp, kirurgiskvård 10sp.





Recommended time for exchange

- Occupational Therapy: year 2, year 3 or year 4 autumn
- Physiotherapy: year 4 autumn or year 3 spring
- Social Services: to be discussed with your programme director
- Sports and Health Promotion: year 2 for whole academic year/ year 3 spring (but other times also possible! Check with Riitta Vienola)





Freemover

In case you don't find a suitable exchange destination among Arcada's partner universities you can apply for exchange to other universities as a "freemover".

- As a freemover you organize your study abroad on your own
- You might have to pay tuition fees
- You won't get a grant from Arcada
- But you have to fill in application form and study plan like all the others!




Practical training abroad

- It is possible to combine studies and practical training (depends on your degree and partner institution)
- Practical training via a partner institution (depends on your degree program and on the partner institution) or independently? N.B.: discuss with the responsible person at your degree program
- Erasmus+ grant for internships in Europe that last 2-12 months

Application process step by step



- Application to Arcada. Apply to be nominated for exchange. Deadline
 3.10.2025→ Selection process
- 2. Nomination for exchange: The international coordinator will contact you by email to let you know if you are nominated for an exchange or not
- **3. Application to host university** (only after you have been nominated), Remember to check the deadline!

4. Confirmation of acceptance from the host university

- 1. **Motivation letter** (describe your study and career related goals) in Swedish or English, hand in together with a study plan to your program before uploading if needed
- 2. international-tutor certificate if you have served as i-tutor



Study plan

- The purpose of the study plan is to ensure that you will receive recognition in your degree for the courses completed abroad
- The study plan <u>must also state which courses will be compensated at Arcada</u>
- The course list in the website of the host institution, at that time available information!
- The exchange studies must be included in a degree pursued at Arcada and the chosen courses at the host institution should therefore be relevant for your curricula at Arcada. You can choose courses that will replace corresponding courses at Arcada or study some of your extension studies abroad.
- Fill in planned period of the mobility (start month/year and end month/year). The semester dates and the study period varies from university to university. Check the semester dates on the host university's webpage for incoming exchange students.

- You must study full time while on exchange and you should achieve approx. 30
 ECTS in one term and 60 ECTS in one year.

Before submitting your application

- Check our website (start.arcada.fi → Study guide → Studies abroad)
- Read travel reports from former exchange students
- Visit the host university website to find out about their courses and services
- Check when the semesters start and end at the host university!



Selection process



 After it is confirmed that the student is eligible for an exchange, the selection process will take place in order to divide the exchange places in a fair way.

- Start → How do I apply → Selection process
- The international coordinator will contact you in 2-5 weeks after the deadline to let you know if you are nominated for an exchange or not



What happens after I have submitted my application and what is the selection process?

Selection process

You will receive an answer within 2-5 weeks after the application deadline. We will contact you if something is unclear. We will process all applications after the application period. If we receive more applications than available exchange places we will rank the applications. Selection criteria:

- success in studies: Points will be handed out according to the average grade. (Maximum 5 points)
- motivation and study and career related goals for the exchange.
 - strong motivation and clear goals (4 points)
 - strong motivation but not clear goals/clear goals but not strong motivation (2 points)
 - neither strong motivation or clear goals (0 points)
- Active as an international-tutor: tutor certificate issued by ASK of proven activity (1 point). O points without certificate.



Application to the host university

- Only after you have been nominated!
- Different universities have different application procedures and dates
- Check the deadline already now!
 - Can sometimes be before our own dl!
- It is your own responsibilty to hand in all the required documents on time
- Housing: Most universities assist incoming exchange students in arranging accommodation.



And then?

 Confirmation of acceptance from the host university – remember to let us know!

- Pre-departure 1: Practical information (Grants, Kela etc.)
- Pre-departure 2: Cultural training, employability, self reflection tools
- Dates will be send to your Arcada e-mail!

Things to think about before applying

- ✓ Why do I want to go for a student exchange? How motivated am I?
- ✓ During what point in my studies would be the most suitable time to go?
- ✓ How successful have I been in my studies?
- ✓ What about my financial situation? Make a budget!
- ✓ Have I got the required language skills?
- ✓ How do I feel health-wise?
- ✓ How flexible and independent am I?

Remember that you need to be active in the process!







Remember

- We are here to support you but you are in charge of the application process. Make sure you hand in all documents on time.
- Please contact the responsible person at your programme with questions regarding courses
- **start.arcada.fi** most probably have the answers to most of your questions
- You have to be signed present at Arcada when you go on an exchange, otherwise you cannot apply for the grants, get student funding from Kela or go through our exchange agreements
- Studies abroad cannot be used as a reason to apply for extended studytime at Arcada after your return
- Never buy the flight ticket before you are sure that you can go or have the visa in your hand (if needed)
- Never give up your flat here before everything is arranged
